82/2024.	<p>Apologies were received from Cllr Piper (away), Cllr Motton (Ill) and PCSO Cocks.</p>
	<p>Chairman to open the meeting by welcoming the public and councillors. Chairman invited the public to address the meeting on any items on the agenda. <i>All members of the public expressed their concerns regarding the activities that are taking place in the agricultural building subject to Planning application PA22/06318 dated the 22nd September 2022 at St Cadix, St Veop. Members complaints consisted of non- agricultural businesses being run from the building, alcoholic drink also being sold and a number of loud parties with music being held at the venue which are going on late into the night. Cllr Hancock advised the public to report their concerns to Cornwall Council enforcement team, he said that the council would raise a complaint as they only supported the planning application for agricultural use only. Members of the public also raised the question of a speed limit through St Veop and the possibility of signs warning of Horses on the road, Cornwall Cllr C Martin said he would look into this matter.</i></p>

The question of extra powers to councils have come up again under the new government who are suggesting a merger of Devon and Cornwall with one Mayor.
